Entries received after this date will be accepted but not be catalogued.

**Entry fee:** \$5 for all classes, Student Creations no entry fee.

Prizemoney: Minimum prize money paid will be 1st \$6, 2nd \$4, 3rd \$3. Sponsorship in

many classes increases prize money.

Confirmation of entries will be sent to each exhibitor once their entry has been received by the Show. Tickets will be posted (one ticket per exhibitor) and will include information regarding stalls, parking and Show maps.

#### CONDITIONS OF ENTRY FOR HandMADE SECTION:

- 1. An entry is eligible for one class only and are not to have been entered before.
- 2. The confirmation of entries sent with your tickets, must be attached to your entries.
- 3. Entries will be accepted at the Show Office (First floor on the Grandstand) the week prior to the Show between the hours of 8.30am and 5pm.
- 4. Final delivery time is 10am to 1pm on Sunday 16 October 2016 to the HandMADE Community area Under the Grandstand. Entries are to be delivered direct to Stewards.
- 5. Judging is on Monday 17 October.
- 6. Consideration will be given to the suitability of design, fabric, technique and finishing of the article being judged. Wearable articles must not have been worn prior to exhibiting.
- 7. All exhibits must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor.
- 8. All articles must be handmade unless otherwise stated in the class schedule and should have been completed within the last 12months.
- 9. All exhibitors enter articles at their own risk. While all care is taken the Hawke's Bay A&P Society will not be responsible for loss, damage or incorrect delivery of any exhibit. Please make arrangements with your own insurance company if you wish to do so.
- 10. Entries can be collected at the conclusion of the Show, from 5pm on Friday 21 October, or from Tuesday 25 October from the Show Office.

- 400 Knitting, 6 18 Yrs. Knitted Items or Article
- 401 Handcraft, 6-18yrs An Item in Any Material E.g. Fabric, Jewellery, Beads
- Alpaca Fibre Woolcraft, Elkencroft Alpacas

  Any medium can be used, e.g. Knitting, Crochet, Felting, Needle Felting, Weaving.

  No less than 80% Alpaca to be used, please state any other fibres used. If Milled yarn is used, please supply label from miller or retailer.
- Any wooden item, (does not have to be turned on a lathe)

  Toys need to be safe and suitable for a child to play with.
- 410 Garden in Ceramic Dish . using sand or dirt, can have embellishments
- 411 Animal made from vegetables
- 412 Necklace made from sweets/lollies
- 413 Floral arrangement . a posy or vase arrangement with fresh flowers
- 420 Home Baking . 3 plain scones
- 421 Home Baking . 3 uniced biscuits
- 422 Home Baking -- 1 slice of iced banana cake with plain chocolate icing

#### Woodcraft

#### 9890 Decorated Bowls

Wooden items which have been turned into a bowl shape which may be decorated, coloured, textured or otherwise enhanced. There is no size prescription.

#### 9891 Constructed Piece

Do not have to be turned on a lathe. May be an object of multiple pieces eg. Small furniture, lidded boxes etc

#### 9892 Plain Bowls

Wooden items which have been turned into a bowl shape finished on a lathe, all surfaces having been finished on a lathe. No detailing, decoration, colouring, texturing, embellishment or re-shaping with other tools. There is no size prescription.

#### 9893 Plates / Platters

Wooden items, which may be decorated with other materials which have been turned to a plate/platter shape on a lathe, and may be decorated with other materials. The height must not exceed 20% of the diameter, e.g. a 250 mm diameter piece must not exceed 50 mm in height.

#### 9894 Hollow Forms / Vases

Hollow forms are wooden items which have been turned on a lathe through a hole which is significantly smaller than the diameter of the finished work. Vases are wooden items which are at least twice as high as the greatest diameter and have been hollowed while turning on a lathe through the main opening. Both hollow forms and vases may be decorated with other materials.

#### 9895 Domestic Ware

Wooden items which may be decorated with other materials. This includes items such as rolling pins, spoons/scoops, egg cups, goblets, salt and pepper shakers, egg timers, lamp stands, stools and any other item the maker believes to be utilitarian in a domestic situation. Size not to exceed 1500 mm for the longest axis plus width and

depth at the widest points measured at right angles to the longest axis.

#### 9896 Lidded Boxes

Any wooden item with a lid that fits into, or over the body of the work, to enclose a useable space within. Maximum size at the extremities 250 mm.

#### 9897 Ornamental

Any ornamental, sculptured or abstract item made of wood involving some use of the lathe in making; or carved turning being any item with more than 50% of the surface carved or textured; or marquetry, intarsia and scroll saw work which creates a recognisable picture from one or many pieces of wood.

#### 9898 Woodcarving

Any item carved from a single piece of wood, which may be decorated with other materials. Size not to exceed 1500 mm for the longest axis plus width and depth at the widest points measured at right angles to the longest axis, including any stand which supports the carved item.

#### 9899 Toys

The item does not have to be turned on a lathe, but does need to be suitable, including finish, for children to be able to play with.

#### 9900 Natural

Any single piece of wood, which may be turned on a lathe or shaped with other tools, and retains a part of the natural surface of the wood as it was found, or after the bark has fallen off.

#### Supreme HandMADE Exhibit

All first place entries will be judged separately to award the Supreme HandMADE Community entry, winning a tri colour Royal Show ribbon.

#### Junior Section (Years 7, 8, 9 & 10)

1st - \$75.00 2nd - \$50.00 3rd - \$30.00

Years 7 to 10 . Make a fashion accessory e.g. bag, hat, soft jewellery, cushion, toy. Commercial patterns may be used.

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1st - $75.00, 2nd - $50.00 3rd $30.00
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Years 7 to 10. Create a day wear garment, commercial patterns may be used.

#### Intermediate Section (Year 11)

1st - \$150.00, 2nd - \$100.00, 3rd - \$75.00

Create a garment for any occasion (including evening wear) . commercial patterns may be used.

#### Senior Section (Years 12 & 13)

1st - \$200.00, 2nd . \$150.00, 3rd - \$100.00

Create a garment for any Occasion (including evening wear) . commercial patterns may be used.

#### Costume Making (Open entry)

1<sup>st</sup> - \$100.00, 2<sup>nd</sup> - \$75.00, 3<sup>rd</sup> - \$50.00

Make a costume for an event or performance. Commercial patterns may be used.

#### Young Designer (Years 12 & 13)

1st . 250.00, 2nd - \$150.00, 3rd - \$100.00

Create an original outfit/ensemble consisting of three complimenting pieces. Any category of garment can be entered e.g. street wear, day wear, sportswear, evening wear and costumery; for men or women. You may also enter ensembles made from recycled fabrics.

Commercial patterns may be used but must be modified to show adaptation skills and original thinking. Please include portfolio evidence to show your design thinking.

#### Special 'Royal' Show Wool Category

1<sup>st</sup> - \$100.00, 2<sup>nd</sup> - \$75.00, 3<sup>rd</sup> - \$50.00

Create any garment for any occasion . commercial patterns may be used. The garment must be made with natural wool fibre in some form. At least half of the fibre content of the garment must be wool and can include felting, knitting etc.

#### Sustainable Design (All ages entry)

1st - \$100.00, 2nd - \$75.00, 3rd - \$50.00

Create a fashion garment using recycled fabrics and/or upcycled garments. The entire garment could be made from upcycling other garments or you could create a new garment using recycled fabrics from a commercial pattern

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
